We want to unleash the pride so many people feel for our area, not only to eliminate litter and dog mess, but also to enable everybody here to make a positive contribution to our environment. We can take inspiration from the 'guerrilla gardeners' you may have noticed around the neighbourhood!

STANMORE SOCIAL **COMMUNITY GARDEN** LAUNCH



ON FRIDAY 8TH AUGUST AN ENTHUSIASTIC CROWD ATTENDED THE STANMORE SOCIAL COMMUNITY GARDEN LAUNCH. JOINED BY JAMES DORNAN MSP.

The garden is comprised of three terraces linking Stanmore Road and Cumming Drive. Currently an expanse of neglected concrete, this space has the potential to become a productive and beautiful space in the heart of Mount Florida. Plans for the garden include an orchard, vegetable and flower beds, fruit bushes, play equipment, accessible ramp, seating and a shelter. Everybody had fun marking the launch with seed bombs, nature weaving, apple pressing, live music and tasty snacks.

The project is supported by a Stalled Spaces grant of £2500 and other grant applications are pending. The project is a partnership between Stanmore Social, Urban Roots and Cathcart & District Housing Association.

As we continue with our aims to improve parking, the environment and other things affecting residents, we look forward to working with the business association to help make Mount Florida a great place to live, work and shop!

[HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?


Community Councils are the most local tier of democratic representation in Scotland, their purpose being to give a voice to people on the most local issues. They are noncommercial and non-party political.

Community councils are especially important for areas like Mount Florida that can fall between the gaps in local and central government priorities: having fewer social and health problems than the average; having higher than average employment rates; but not being a centre of commerce and wealth.

MoFloCoCo has 18 unpaid and democratically elected Councillor positions, but some places are currently vacant. We have statutory roles in the planning and licensing processes, and we can speak loudly on any issue of local interest.

As Community Councillors retire or move out of the area we need a constant flow of new, motivated candidates. We'll invite nominations to the council at the October Annual General Meeting, with nominations due by 10th October. GLASGOW 2014



Glasgow 2014 has been described as the best ever Commonwealth Games, and thousands of Glaswegians made their inimitable impression on 'the friendly games'. How did it go for us, the neighbours of Hampden, and what is the Games legacy for Mount Florida?

In September 2013, MoFloCoCo started working with Glasgow 2014. You had told us you wanted clear information about the arrangements so that you could plan around them.

During the course of our campaign of meetings, letterwriting, press releases and TV interviews, MoFloCoCo used its influence for your benefit, including:

- We persuaded Glasgow 2014 to relax the constraints on deliveries for local businesses.
- We persuaded Glasgow 2014 of the need to deliver information to every address in the area.
- We persuaded Glasgow 2014 that there would insufficient parking space for residents, resulting in the overflow parking at Queens Park and shuttle bus.
- We persuaded GCC to make available a help line for problems with parking permit infringements.

We compiled the available information into an information sheet that we distributed online. In general it seems most residents were able to enjoy the Games.

But what is the long term legacy for Mount Florida, other than parking restrictions and a few road and pavement improvements? This is what we will continue to ask our City Councillors in the months ahead.

PARKING

A year on from the implementation of controversial new parking restrictions, MoFloCoCo is continuing its campaign for a thorough review. The 'Routes to Hampden bus infrastructure', Traffic Regulation Order saw a significant reduction in parking availability on Cathcart Road and in the surrounding residential streets, especially around Bolton Drive and Clincart Road.



Over several months of dialogue with Land &

Environmental Services we achieved a few small victories including the removal of restrictions at the top of Carmunnock Road, the removal of contradictory signage, and the shortening of the double-yellow lines on Clincart Road.

Our most significant achievement was to extract a commitment from LES to a thorough review of the restriction to begin after the Commonwealth Games when LES officals would be released from Games-related pressures. This commitment was supported by Councillor Archie Graham.

We expect to see a thorough review of the arrangements with consideration for both residents and businesses. Ouestions we will be asking:

- The Cathcart Road restrictions were intended to promote travel by bus by easing the flow of buses. How have the frequency of bus services and volume of car commuters changed?
- What have been the consequences of the Cathcart Road restriction for local life, including residents, businesses and employment?
- The restrictions in the residential streets were intended to improve pedestrian safety. Has this worked?
- Could changes create additional parking spaces, for example one-way streets with diagonal spaces?

Without the great response we received from local residents to MoFloCoCo's previous consultation we would not have got the commitment for a review. Now again we will ensure local people can have their say on how our streets are managed. Please keep in touch on social media, or sign up for the e-newsletter on our website.
