1. Welcome and Apologies:

7. Covid-19 response locally:

There were discussions about potential public space pinch points around Mount Florida. There was a consensus that the most pressing pinch point was the bus stop beside Lupton's butcher shop. A TRO is already in place for building out the bus stop.

8. Letherby update:

Community Council is to utilise Survey Legend to undertake an online community consultation with local residents and groups June /July, This will allow local stakeholders to share their opinions on the areas of the design on which there is flexibility, such as street furniture, lighting and planting.

Tanya Wisely will ask Council staff to arrange a four-way meeting of interested parties (the football academy, Third Lanark juniors, cycle speedway club and local residents) to discuss the future of

Cathkin Park and managing differing interests. Chris will submit in an objection on the siting of the shipping containers to Glasgow City Council on behalf of the Community Council.
